




ARTICULATION AGREEMENT





"IF YOU'RE NOT A DOCTOR, WHO IS?"

Guess who asked me the question above many years ago? It was Dr. Richard Drake, the co-founder of Primus University. It was the first time we met. Dr. Karen Drake was with him. Dr. Drake asked me about my ministry, where I had been, what I had done, what I felt my calling was, where I would like to be in the future, and the like. I thought he had done this before, but I also felt he cared about what I was doing.

As I informed him of my background then, he broke his silence. "Ed, if you're not a Doctor of Ministry, Who Is?" "You've written one book and are 90% of the way through another book, growing a large church from scratch, growing a successful business from scratch, and now have traveled to 80 different countries, teaching and revealing the Word of God to thousands of people. You have both education and experience. You're much more than an academic; you're a pracademic. Has anyone ever accredited and validated what you have done? Do you have a post-graduate degree?"

Well, as they say, the rest is history. Yes, I could have continued in my ministry without a degree. It would probably have been successful. But I can tell you that having the Dr. Ed Delph title has opened many doors that would not have been opened to me if I didn't have the degree. The degree gave me favor in strategic places I would not have otherwise.

For example, Dr. C. Peter Wagner would never have considered me to represent apostolic movements and new church moments on The National Association of Ecclesiolatry. That is where I met Dr. Timothy George, the executive director of Christianity Today and the President of Beeson Divinity School and Samford University. I would not have spoken in the Australian Parliament twice in hearings. I would not have the accreditation to talk in many seminaries and Bible schools worldwide. I could go on and on with examples.

I've noticed that many people treat you differently when they see that title before your name. There is gravitas that accompanies the title that opens hearts, doors, and minds. I say, why not be recognized for being who you are? As Dick Drake said to me a long time ago, I am saying to you, "If you're not a doctor, who is?"

Allow Primus University to be your Aaron and Hur in giving you university-level credit for your life's education and your experience. Experience matters in getting you to where you want to go.

Who is this Person?

In the Corporate World: CEO EVANGELIST

Local businessman shares the gospel with CEOs of Major Corporations

Evidence of his future success and business savvy surfaced at a young age.

As a third grader, he wanted to purchase milk and a donut in the cafeteria like many of the other kids. But he could not afford the price – a nickel. He only had the burros, (flour Tortillas), he brought from home. Embarrassed, he and his brother often ate their burros in the back of the school, away from the other students. But he knew there would be a larger food selection if he could afford to eat in the cafeteria. Undaunted by the challenge, he did the only thing he could do.

He convinced his classmates that his burros were better than their lunches and began selling the burrow for a dime. Not only did he make enough money to buy a carton of milk and a doughnut, but he also made a profit. It wouldn't be the last time.

He and eleven other Hispanic partners reached a historic agreement to purchase 400,000 telecommunication lines in Texas and New Mexico from GTE, creating the largest Hispanic-owned Telecommunications Company in the country. However, life was not always easy for the businessman who served as a Business Advisor for Presidents George Bush and Bill Clinton.

Raised in a Catholic home, as the second of four children, he inherited a strong work ethic from his parents. He said most of his clothing came from the Salvation Army. However, where they lacked in finances they made up for in character and determination. "My dad taught me there wasn't nothing I couldn't do."

He also owned a wire manufacturing company, a general construction company, and an electrical construction company. He said that as a youth, he remembers being ashamed of his family's financial situation due to his father having to fight cancer and being Hispanic.

Once in grade school, he was humiliated by a teacher who used him as an example to other students, telling them how not to speak english. Although bilingual, he said the pain of that incident caused him to abandon speaking Spanish. Nevertheless, the struggles and pain also helped build his character and fueled his desire to succeed. I would always profess that I was going to be successful. He was one of the first children in his family to graduate from High School, and after that, he enlisted in the Marine Corps to help pay for his education.



After the military, he worked as a draftsman for an engineering firm while attending Phoenix College. He set a personal goal to become a millionaire by the time he was thirty, and that couldn't happen if he missed work. He reached the goal at age thirty-two.

His wife Sylvia would prove to be an important asset to his life, naturally and spiritually. Neither were Christians at the time of their wedding; she was the first to give her life to Christ. This encounter changed his life. He submitted his life to Christ and also gained an understanding of his purpose and destiny.

Initially, his friends were surprised to hear about his conversion. Since he was a successful man, many could not understand why he became a Christian. "As far as business dealings, I had always been successful. So when I accepted the Lord, people wanted

to know why?" It soon became apparent. He believes God planned to use him to impact the

business community. Because of his business success, he often meets with CEO's of Fortune 500

companies and political leaders. This allowed him to share the gospel with some of the wealthiest

people in the country.

"With God's favor comes awesome responsibility," he said.
